

## **CBS Skating Club Ice Show Policies**

1. All skaters taking part in the Ice Show must register by the deadline. Late entries will not be accepted.
2. Refund requests for Ice Show Participants will only be accepted for 7 days after the registration deadline. After this time refunds will no longer be available.
3. Skater groupings, music/music length, and costumes will be determined by coaches.
4. Assigned groups, music and costumes are final.
5. Partial members of the CBS Skating Club are not eligible to participate in the ice show.
6. During the Dress Rehearsal and Ice Show, only accredited skaters, coaches and parent volunteers will be allowed in the dressing rooms or at Ice level. Any parents interested in volunteering must sign up ahead of time and will be assigned a duty.

## **Solo Skater Selection Policy**

### Objective

To provide the Board of Directors with a criteria for the selection of solo skaters. The selection is based on giving priority to the higher level skaters who have had success in competition, as well as having the opportunity to promote lower level skaters who have achieved excellent results.

### Policy Guidelines

1. Any changes to this selection criteria is to be made prior to the start of competitions.
2. Recommendation of solo skaters should be made to the Board of Directors by the Technical Director/Ice Show Committee.
3. The number of solo skaters should be limited to eight. A solo would include singles, dance or pairs.
4. All solo skaters must be in good standing with the club.
5. The Technical Director/Ice Show Committee may recommend to the Board of Directors additional solos or mini-groups, in extenuating circumstances.

### Criteria for Selection

The basis for the selection criteria is recognition of ranking of skaters by competition level combined with medal results. Notes: Higher categories are given priority as it takes a longer dedication to the sport to even reach the higher levels.

Soloists are chosen according to the following list of priorities:

1. Skaters who qualify for Challenge, Nationals or Canada Winter Games
2. Sectionals / Gold
3. Sectionals / Silver
4. Sectionals / Bronze
5. Provincials / Senior – Pre-Juvenile / Gold
6. Provincials / Gold – STAR 4 / Gold
7. Provincials / Senior – Pre-Juvenile / Silver
8. Provincials / Gold – STAR 4 / Silver
9. Provincials / Senior – Pre-Juvenile / Bronze
10. Provincials / Gold – STAR 4 / Bronze
11. Atlantic Qualifiers / Competitive Categories
12. Atlantic Qualifiers / STAR Categories

Categories should be prioritized from highest to lowest. Categories with multiple age brackets are ordered from youngest category to oldest.

## Additional Ice Show Numbers

- CanSkate - Number of Groups based on the number of participants, as decided by the Technical Director and Ice Show Coaches.
- STARSkate - Number of Groups based on the number of participants, as decided by the Technical Director and Ice Show Coaches. Recommendations are: Gold, Silver, and Bronze Groups or division by level (ie: STAR 1&2, STAR 3&4, STAR 5+), for a recommended maximum of 4 Groups. The highest level Group will also be the "Closing Number".
- Mini-Groups - Maximum of 2 Groups of 3 or 4 skaters, chosen as the next 4-8 skaters in line based on the soloist policy.
- Opening Number - Consists of all skaters competing at the Eastern Divisional's.
- Synchro - A Maximum of 4 Synchro numbers, based in order of highest level and highest placing at the SCNL Synchronized Skating Championships. Synchro teams are chosen according to the following list of priorities:
  - Senior - Junior / Gold
  - Open - Intermediate / Gold
  - Novice - Elementary / Gold
  - Senior - Junior / Silver
  - Open - Intermediate / Silver
  - Novice - Elementary / Silver
  - Senior - Junior / Bronze
  - Open - Intermediate / Bronze
  - Novice - Elementary / Bronze
  - Adult I - Adult III / Gold
  - Adult I - Adult III / Silver
  - Adult I - Adult III / Bronze

If 4 Synchro teams were not able to be chosen, selection may continue through 4<sup>th</sup> placing etc.
